Greetings From Dean Buchanan

Saturday, February 1, 2003, marked the first anniversary of my service as Dean at the University at Buffalo School of Dental Medicine. Before arriving here, I knew the School primarily through the national prominence of its faculty leaders and its reputation for productivity and excellence in science and innovations in clinical education, educational methodology and the use of information technology. First-hand observation and experience during my first year have confirmed that the School most certainly deserves its reputation for high-quality, balanced academic programs. Of equal importance to me is the high collegiality quotient among faculty and the community spirit manifest by staff, students and faculty. The SDM family cares about this institution and about each other. These characteristics combined with long-standing traditions of excellence not only make it a pleasure to work here but also offer tremendous advantages in many other ways, especially in student and faculty recruitment.



Each Thursday I interview the most highly qualified applicants to our predoctoral education program. This affords an opportunity to explore the applicants' goals and their impressions of our School and its comparison to other schools where they have interviewed. It is always very edifying. There are a variety of comments, but four favorable impressions are universal among these applicants:

the evident programmatic excellence, the variety of academic experiences available, the structure of the comprehensive care group oriented clinical education program, and, most important, the amiable, caring attitude of our students, staff and faculty. All of these highly qualified students have accepted positions in next fall's entering class.

I am also pleased to report that, despite the increased challenges associated with recruitment in an era of serious faculty workforce shortages, our first two faculty recruitments of this academic year have been successfully concluded. Dr. M. Margaret Vickerman, an experienced investigator with significant NIH support, has accepted an appointment as an Associate Professor in our Department of Periodontics and Endodontics. Meg, who joins us this month from the Indiana University School of Dentistry, received a DMD from Tufts in 1982 and an MS in Endodontics in 1990 and a Ph.D. in Microbiology and Immunology in 1991 from the University of Michigan. Dr. Vickerman's research interests focus on the microbiology associated with carries -- more specifically on the genetic regulation of glucan synthesis by Strepococcus gordonii. She will strengthen our research program through her own work and through collaborations with colleagues in the Department of Oral Biology.

Dr. Hiran Perinpanayagam, currently a Postdoctoral Fellow at the University of Iowa College of Dentistry, also joins the faculty of our Department of Periodontics and Endodontics this month. Hiran received a DDS in 1989 from the University of Otago in New Zealand, an MS in Biochemistry in 1995 from the University of Rochester School of Medicine, an AEGD Certificate in 1997 from the University of Rochester Eastman Dental Center, and a Specialty Certificate in Endodontics in 2001 from the University of Iowa College of Dentistry. He is currently completing investigations on osteoblast expression of bone proteins as a part of his Ph.D. thesis and expects to receive this degree from the University of Iowa in the spring. Dr. Perinpanayagam will continue his basic research here, contribute to an enhancement of our clinical research program, and make a major contribution to the Advanced Specialty Education Program in Endodontics.

We are very fortunate that these outstanding faculty and students will be joining the University at Buffalo academic community. Such highly qualified candidates have choices. All received offers of admission or faculty appointment at one or more of our peer institutions. The competition is serious, but all want to be here in Buffalo at the School of Dental Medicine. This reflects well on our School and community and refutes the friendly, but sadly uninformed, comments about Buffalo I frequently receive from my colleagues in the lower latitudes. It also confirms my view that academic atmosphere is much more important than ambient climate.

Examining Ourselves; By Michael G. Maihofer, DDS



It was just last summer. A young mother and her two sons came to my office seeking a second opinion. She brought along copies of treatment plans for each child proposed by another dentist. The mother confided that although the family was covered by dental insurance, it was still going to be financially difficult to meet the co-pay portion of the proposed treatment plans. After glancing at the plans, which called for occlusal restorations on almost every permanent molar and bicuspid in each child's mouth, I offered to take a look.

Expecting the worst, I put on my loupes, picked up a sharp explorer, and began my exam of the first child. I went carefully through each arch twice, also examining the bitewing copies they'd brought along. To my surprise, I found no caries anywhere! I went through the entire mouth again. It was difficult finding any questionable grooves, and there was minimal occlusal stain. Upon examining the younger child, I found two interproximal cavities on primary molars, but not the 10 areas of decay proposed by the other dentist.

When I discussed my findings with their mother, she accepted my findings, thanked me, and made an appointment to bring the younger child back for his restorations.

This wasn't the first time I'd seen this. Many dentists confess to seeing more and more of it – discussing it in hushed tones at local dental society meetings. So it was hardly surprising when I signed on to American Online last March and found a pop-up title that asked: 'How Honest Is Your Dentist?' The gist of the story was that everyone needs to be a smart dental consumer – that all dentists, although educated the same, don't treat all patients in the same manner. And, that if you're not careful, it could have 'discomforting financial consequences' for you and your loved ones. It explained that a sharp decline in cavities and a dwindling number of practitioners has led to patient exploitation in the form of excessive treatment, the promotion of cosmetic dentistry and the marketing of unproven 'technological advances.'

The article argues that dentistry, unlike medicine, is largely self-regulated and lacks recognized standards of care. The standards or parameters that have been adopted offer considerable 'wiggle room' for any practitioner to justify almost any treatment he or she sees fit. After explaining that there is almost nowhere a consumer can go for guidance, the article concluded with several tips on finding an honest dentist.

Isn't it time we begin to question what's happening to our profession? What's amazing is how readily accepting some patients have been of this situation. Many, surprisingly, are not outraged upon hearing of such treatment plan disparities. It's as though they've gone to several car dealerships in search of the best deal, the least mark-up, before deciding to buy.

Has dentistry become a commodity one purchases like a car or a refrigerator? And what does that say about our professionals and the public's perception of us?

Maybe we are our own problem. And, if we don't work on fixing it now, perhaps others outside our profession will do it for us. Third party insurers and the federal government might surely welcome further attempts to limit our practices. But they have no business doing so, and we, as a profession, must never give them reason to.

Organized dentistry, with its codes of ethics, position papers, and parameters of care, can only go so far. Ultimately, the solution lies inside each one of us. Each of us is intelligent enough to recognize acceptable vs. overtreatment, necessary vs. elective dentistry, proven vs. unproven technology, and right from wrong.

Honesty, morality or ethics can't be mandated. We must never forget that only by acting responsibly, honorably and ethically can we continue to earn the public's trust and in turn receive the respect and autonomy that such behavior deserves. After all, that's what it means to be a professional.

Hiring the right person keeps practice on track

Suppose at the end of your biggest workday ever, you learn that your administrative coordinator is leaving. Before you make a rash decision in hiring a replacement, Ronald F. Arndt, DDS, MS, writing in the July 2002 ODA Today (Ohio Dental Association), offers these tips:

- 1. Identify what you want. Create an 'Ideal Profile' that represent all the characteristics & traits you want in a new employee.
- 2. Think, act and behave like a CEO. Be prepared and decisive when the time is right to hire the talent you need to support your vision for your patients and practice.
- 3. Make 'Right Hiring' a priority. Make it the top priority to find and retain the talented people who will have the greatest impact on your stress level, business growth and profitability.
- 4. Have a strategy in place. Rather than wait for things to happen, decide in advance what you want. Arndt says to choose to hire BIG and if necessary expand your business into your growing talent pool.
- 5. Evaluate your capacity needs. Arndt advises practitioners to consider staffing to meet peak productivity demand times, better positioning the dental team to meet patients' needs.
- 6. Identify options. Determine whether the work can be spread among existing employees, and consider whether temporary workers, interns or family members could serve staffing levels.
- Don't keep it a secret. If no one knows you have a position available, chances are low that you'll find the 'right' person. Besides a newspaper ad, announce the open position to patients, vendors, friends and colleagues.
- 8. Enroll your team. Arndt says get staff involved and excited about the quest for a new employee. He suggests providing staff with the 'ideal profile' of the prospective employee.
- 9. Keep your eyes open. Even when you don't have an immediate need, Arndt advises dentists to be alert for special talent. He says when dentists think 'outside' dentistry, it opens the pool of candidates from a few to an audience of thousands.
- 10. Invest in your business. Help your practice move forward by investing the time and energy in a hiring process that reduces mistakes. When you examine your needs, develop a check list, recruit and hire in a strategic way, and you'll protect your investment, Arndt writes.
